Event description:	

This document reports the Study visit and analysis of courses best practices in EU countries of the Erasmus+ Capacity Building in the Field of Higher Education project "Development of master curricula for natural disasters risk management in Western Balkan countries" (NatRisk), held at the Middlesex University London (MUHEC) on 28 June 2017. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Sally Priest, Flood Hazard Research Centre Middlesex University. The objective was to introduce to all WB project partners the most relevant issues related to the social aspects of vulnerability as well as Engaging communication to build local capacities to flood risk.

Seventeen representatives from 5 partner institutions were present at the meeting (13 out of 17 were from WB partner HEIs – UNI, UNID, UPKM, TCASU).

After the participants' registration, which started at 10:00, Dr. Mike Dawney, former Middlesex Institutional Erasmus Coordinator, gave a welcome speech and introduced the Middlesex University, thereby highlighting university mission, historical development, employability of MUHEC students, MUHEC structure that includes faculties and four campuses.

Dr. Sally Priest, Flood Hazard Research Centre Middlesex University, thanked all WB partners for their participation at this study visit and gave an introduction into Flood Hazard Research Centre best practices and realized international projects. She presented the topic named Social aspects of vulnerability with working group sessions and highlighted the notion of social vulnerability, health impacts of disaster events including different types of health risks from natural events such as fatalities, injures, psychological impacts, vector borne diseases, food/water/land contamination, malnutrition, worsening pre-existing conditions, affect access to drugs and treatment.

Dr. Simon McCarthy, Flood Hazard Research Centre Middlesex University, presented the topic about engaging communication to build local capacities to flood risk with working group session. He talked about communication context in UK flood risk management such as purpose of risk communication, spatial context and characteristics, temporal context as well as general theorethical approaches finishing with an engagement strategy developement approach session. The study visit finished at 16:00.






