

This is a report of the implementation of international mobility activity between the University of Niš and University of Sarajevo.

The mobility period started on 01.10.2019 and ended on 29.02.2020.

The University of Sarajevo is a public university located in Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina. It is the largest and oldest university in the country, as well as the oldest institution of tertiary learning in the former Yugoslavia, tracing its initial origins to 1537.

I spent my mobility time on Faculty of Civil Engineering. Faculty of Civil Engineering at University of Sarajevo was established in 1949. The Faculty is organized into several departments depending on the subjects of expertise.

My courses were related to the Department of Water Resources. Being a part of this particular mobility project gave me the opportunity to accept additional forms of education and training. During the mobility period, I have acquired a great deal of knowledge, which is primarily related to the natural state of waters, water needs and possibilities of water use, as well as predicting the object to be built, which must be adopted to the laws of water movement.

Hydrotechnics, broadly speaking, encompasses everything that is studied, designed, built and used, for water i.e. because of water. Construction engineers specializing in hydraulics should look at what conditions it is possible to build, with what investments and what is to be gained.

In addition to active research in practice, I took the exams and did various presentations as well as project assignments.
