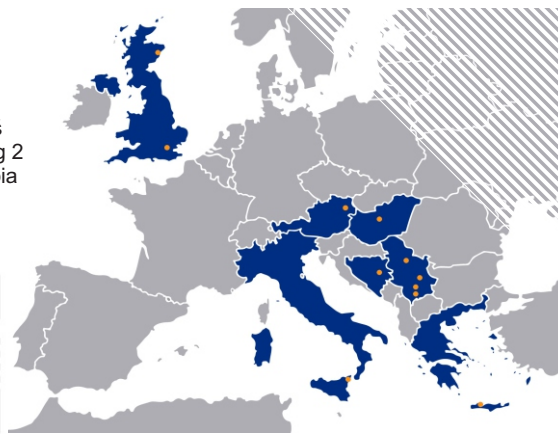

### TRAINING DESCRIPTION:

Participants are introduced to natural disasters to which citizens, public services and business activities are vulnerable.

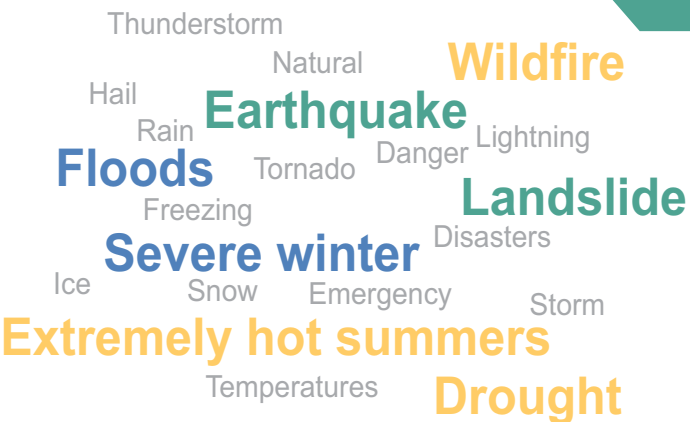
This course also explains emergency planning and management, the regulatory systems, documents, and directives that guide disaster response.

Discuss the response factors: hazard control zones, resources, responder safety and recovery considerations, funding assistance and demobilization.

### ENHANCING CITIZENS' AWARENESS AND SKILLS

NatRisk project specific objectives:

- Surveillance of preparedness in public sector and among citizens regarding natural disasters
- Analysis of best practices in EU countries
- Development and implementation of the new educational training for citizens and public



### RESEARCH RESULTS:

NatRisk survey of total 3059 citizens of WB Countries in spring 2017 has found:

- varying perception of natural disaster risks
- insufficient awareness of natural disaster risks by those in charge
- citizens' willingness to respond to the call for help

- role and responsibilities of the natural disaster risk management team

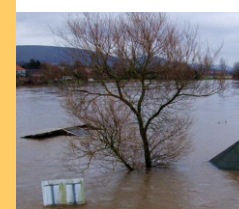
